




Learning Activities: To what extent did the following learning activities contribute to your learning?






Learning Activities: To what extent did the following learning activities contribute to your learning?

The meetings in person provided me with check points that helped keep me in track. I loved hearing about other students' progress during the in–person classes too. It was nice to learn more about their projects, as well as gain more insight for my own.

The in-person classes were great

I could have been more engaged in the class portion, listening and learning from the research process of others. in reality, i wanted to focus on my own project so I often was multitasking (which is on me...) thus, i found the 1:1 help most helpful, even though I know I could have gotten more out of the class part if I had been fully present.

The seminars where we updated each other on our projects could have been less frequent, or could have been used to walk us through various research techniques/ problem solve specific issues.

I believe in class time could be used as a way to prepare students for the next assignment rather than a catch up period from what was most recently due. At the end of the semester, I wish there had been more classes or even informal meetings to allow students to prepare for the final presentation.

I really enjoyed this class, I liked that I had the opportunity to pursue research in something that I was interested in. Kim and Tom supported us through the research process along with my research mentor.

I wish there were more structure to the course. I think there was only one 1–1 meeting with Kim/Tom that we had to sign up for in the Fall semester, but I think having those mandatory 1–1 meetings more consistently or more frequently throughout the year would have been helpful.

The instructors were very nice, but in the future, it would be very valuable to give more feedback and provide more constructive criticism.

It helped me understand how research works which is a very valuable skill, but I also learned I don't love conducting my own research.


I enjoyed this course and felt supported by the course instructors throughout the process.







Comments

Kim always made me feel welcomed in class and encouraged all of us to be ourselves in the classroom.

Professor Olsen and Acquaviva, this class was good and I am glad I got to do this class. My main concern with this class was that it wasn't as rigorous as it should have been. We are performing a thesis project, but the lack of comments on my draft and powerpoint slides was disappointing. I know I am not ready for publication and as professors, it is imperative that you get us there.

A vocal ally for her students, Kim incorporates an understanding of social justice and intersectionality into every day content in a way that welcomes others who are often unseen or unheard in academic settings.

She provided opportunities for class members to speak about the difficulties they were having during their DMP project and this helped welcome diverse perspectives.

Instructor Comments

What constructive suggestions do you have to help Kimberly Acquaviva improve this course for future students?

Comments

I wished that we spent a bit more in class talking about how to complete assignments that are coming up. We do have office hours and a few in–class sessions, but if I would have felt a bit more comfortable with assignments if we had time in class where the instructors can talk a bit more about our assignments (e.x. review of the literature, specific aims) especially during the first semester when we are structuring our projects. A suggestion that I have is maybe having scheduled drop–in office hours during the regular class time so that students can come in and ask for help during the sessions when class is not in–person.

Do not be afraid of giving constructive criticism. Don't baby the students!

a class before the final presentation to practice in front of each other! and maybe more structured time for peer feedback. i know it is hard to coordinate with our practicum schedules though.

In the spring in preparation for the fall semester, it would have been helpful to have a list of professors in the School of Nursing who have ongoing research or have been previously published. This would have helped students find a mentor who could help them through the research process and direct them to resources for research. Each class period was spent as a check-in with each student, and it would have been more helpful to go over resources and guidance for the next assignment. I think one or two classes should be reserved for a research librarian from the Health Sciences Library to come and talk to the class about how to set up Qualtrics and then in the spring semester to learn how to go about cleaning up a data set and what common performed tests may work for a data set. (Ideally, someone with a background in statistics or data science should be attached to the class.) Finally, at the end of the semester, it seemed there was less and less guidance from the course professors when students began the anxious process of preparing for the final presentation. A final class period the last week of classes would have been useful as a time to practice presenting or talk through the presentation day.
