She engaged a lot with the class in the discussion boards and offered great resources. She helped us prepare for our policy proposal as well
Online discussion boards were the main way we contributed in class. The rest was spent reading on our own.
Preparation for and participation in online discussion boards constituted a great majority of my learning in this course.
The recorded messages allowed us to engage in class whenever we were able to instead of having to juggle work, kids, family. The flexibility in the learning environment allowed to engage in a purposeful way.
The weekly discussion post assignments increased my learning during the course. We were provided good sources – text, subscriptions, articles, government websites, to be able to understand and research the topics and were provided very well organized, structured prompts to be able to focus our discussion. We were assigned to write, or choose sometimes, from different points of view than we might have, which added to our analytical capabilities and understanding of sthe perspectives of others. The policy paper was challenging, but I learned a lot during the process. We were also encouraged to use AI for topic selection and refinement and then allowed to use it and cite it for that assignment, which was my first major use of AI and that was valuable in and of itself.
The policy report that we had to write was the biggest contributor to my learning in this course. The paper showed me how to break down a policy into it's individual parts.
The recorded lectures helped me grasp the core concepts, and the discussion boards did encourage close reading and application of ideas. However, three substantial posts every week for all 16 threads made the boards feel like a heavy writing requirement rather than genuine dialogue. In an asynchronous format, posts often repeated similar points and sometimes felt like an echo chamber rather than interactive discussion.
I feel that the policy class is a great class to be online. Kim was very attentive.
The course was 100% asynchronous. It was well structured, it was difficult sometimes because some students posted their discussion posts later in the week, not leaving much time for others to respond.
The discussion boards felt forced but I don't think there was a better way to do it. I don't enjoy them, that doesn't make them bad for the class.
The online discussion forums created a safe and open space where you felt free to space your opinions freely.
The discussion boards and projects through the year definitely contributed to my learning in this course. Your continued feedback throughout discussions was also very helpful!
The discussion boards were helpful because they were challenging enough that I would need to do research to feel like I fully contributed to the post. It helped me learn, and forced me to explore new topics.

Yet at the same time I felt that my opinions although differing was valued and not targeted against. I felt like that alone carries great weight in the academic world. I have felt in the past that is my views didn't conform to what was expected on me then my grade would parish. This instructor means it when she says she wants our opinion, she values it, and all is welcome.
The discussion prompts were very thought provoking for me. At the beginning of the semester I was honestly a little worried about sharing my true views in some of the discussions because the prompts were so politically based and I feared being judged or even graded poorly if my views differed from others. As the semester went on I became increasingly comfortable responding to the discussion posts as it was very clear the professor cared about everyone's freedom of expression and made it a safe and welcoming environment for all. Although this was an online course and I personally did not need to reach out much to Dr. Acquaviva she seemed very approachable and as though she truly cares for the success of her students. I appreciated all the announcements and course communications. I truly did take a lot away from this course and think Dr. Acquaviva was an excellent professor for the course.

I appreciate Dr Acquaviva's sincere enthusiasm for the topic and openness and flexibility with change.
This course was very challenging to keep up with due to the amount of writing, reading, and self-taught material. Dr. Acquaviva was wonderful in building confidence with feedback throughout the course. However, now that I am working on the final exam, I am concerned that I still don't have the understanding needed to to feel confident. I really appreciate that Dr. Acquaviva has asked for our feedback on the course multiple times and has made adjustments. This is the first professor I have had that genuinely asks for feedback and constructive criticism.

Comments
Dr. Acquaviva's expertise and responsiveness to feedback were clear, and I appreciated the adjustments she made during the semester. At the same time, the pacing and writing workload were quite demanding, especially for working students, and the asynchronous format limited real engagement with the instructor and peers. The content is excellent, but it would be better suited to an in-person or hybrid course with live discussion rather than relying so heavily on written posts.
I feel the course was well put together and Kim was very attentive to the needs of the class and open for change.
The course went well. I think it's a great class and I took much from it.
Dr. Acquaviva clearly cares about the topic of health policy, but more importantly, about helping students develop opinions and having to take a stance. The class utilized more of my time than I had hoped, but not necessarily because it was difficult, but because the topics and assignments drew me in. Difficult topics were discussed that took time to develop well-thought-out responses. Additionally, because views can be so different, it allowed for learning and cordial discourse, and to hear other perspectives that might not have been thought about. I also appreciated her willingness to take feedback continuously throughout the course and implement it quickly, and not just wait until the next semester to take the suggestions. It's one way Dr. A is demonstrates they practice what they preach.
Your class is one of the few I have had where the professor has cared for me as an individual. As a large class, I cannot imagine the work you put into providing each student with this experience. I have spoken to other classmates, and they feel similarly. This class is a lot of work, and the content is not something I have any experience with, but you have made it accessible, which is a credit to your skills and effort.

We was welcome to all and showed no biased based on our POV
In each discussion post Dr. Acquaviva made sure to form the prompts in a way that made students feel safe sharing their views. I also really enjoyed the prompts that had us write from the views or roles of other individuals and take different stances than our true beliefs. She also asked for examples for certain posts to not to be related to President Trump which I appreciated given the political climate at the time of the course.
Professor Acquaviva made it very clear that everyone is entitled to their own opinion and encouraged conversations amongst my peers regarding this. She frequently asked us to consider views that were opposite from our own and to respond in that manner. One of the first assignments was a 1:1 interview with someone who had a different political view from myself. This was very eye opening for me.
In every discussion board it was obvious there would be mixed opinions. Every student was made aware disrespectful language would not be tolerated. Dr A was really intentional about getting us to see each others perspectives.
She made sure to preface each discussion post with a statement that reminded us to be respectful to one another and to respect all viewpoints.
Dr. Kim always made it known that any perspective was welcome in our discussion posts and to always be cordial to one another even if we disagree. She also had us put ourselves into the shoes of someone with a different opinion than us as well, which was helpful.
They encouraged you to think from the other view and consistently put out reminders that we needed to be respectful regardless of our political beliefs. It was a good reminder and very grounding.
She was very welcoming of different views and oppositions. Made it clear in her discussion posts and assignments to be respectful.

Comments
Her paper in the beginning where we interviewed people with opposing viewpoints and wrote a reflection was really great. And she never made a student feel uncomfortable for their views
It is very clearly described in lectures, in written material, in the syllabus, and on every discussion post.
Dr. Acquaviva constantly reminded us of the course rules and values regarding respecting each other's perspectives.
We were encouraged to share our honest opinions but in a respectful and thoughtful manner.
Dr. Acquaviva went above and beyond to create an environment that respected differences and welcomed diverse perspectives. She offered numerous keen insights that aided in our learning while also maintaining impressive neutrality during discussions.
The instructor created ways in which we felt safe to express our opinions or concerns by doing different things such as guiding the conversation to a more balanced, structured, and respectful dynamic.
She encouraged us to defend our opinions and ideologies with evidence. She also made sure to note everyone should be respectful and added that some statements may not reflect actual student opinion, but students may have chosen an opposite approach.
Set expectations in the beginning of respecting different viewpoints and reminding us there would be students with various political beliefs. Reinforced and reminded us of these expectations. She exemplified respecting different perspectives in her words and responses to students. She had us choose our perspectives sometimes, and other times, assigned us varied or differing perspectives to write from. She included resources at the beginning of the class that specifically look at issues from different perspectives.
At the beginning of the course, Dr. Acquaviva made us all aware that we would have differences of opinion in this class due to our diverse backgrounds. She made in a point to tell us to make sure we made everyone feel welcome in this class, especially since we would be debating health policy.
The discussion boards were an open place to state your opinions without feeling judgement.
The professor allowed for all voices to be heard and sometimes made us give our discussion posts on hypothetical opinions.
Consistently encouraged people to have different opinions, but also created a place and a format that couldn't be taken too far or have others react emotionally. While the topics were challenging and controversial, they were presented in a way that really took "most" of the worry/concern for sharing a genuine and true opinion on the matters.
Dr Acquaviva made it abundantly clear from day 1 that the expectation was respect and welcoming behavior. We were reminded often that learning would be fostered by creating a safe and positive environment and that that is all that would be tolerated. She also lead the class with such strong kindness and showed us that she valued each and every one of us.

I appreciated her for doing that. She frequently encouraged us to share our honest thoughts and opinions about things in a respectful. professional manner, which also enriched our discussions. I felt like she valued our perspectives and our honesty, and encouraged us to be open minded to others viewpoints even if they don't align with ours.

Comments
I think this course is all encompassing, yet if I had to pick one things. Choose a topic with the conservative POV as a positive cogitation. See how your class opinions change. I feel that moves students tell professors what they want to hear based on hearing the assumption of an opinion in the directions that they stay the course. Change the voice, see if others follow, that will truly challenge independent thinking
I personally preferred the initial discussion post grading criteria of posting once at the beginning of the week, in the middle, and at the end of the week. Even though I have been working full time during this course and was initially worried about finding time during my work week to complete those posts during the required times, I found it to be a much better system. Once the criteria shifted to just be required to make 3 posts by the end of the week, I often found that many people in my policy pod were waiting until the end of the week to post their initial posts which made it difficult for me to balance being able to respond to peers posts, complete other assignments, work and maintain personal life duties. I personally think the initial criteria was more fair to those who really need to schedule out their assignments for the week do to other life commitments.

I have not had an online discussion based class in over ten years and the professor did make this a very doable transition to returning back to classes, allowing ample time to complete assignments, and provided encouraging feedback. Her modules and assignments were very engaging which I did appreciate.
A little bit more time on the discussion posts, and deadlines at midnight was very helpful

I would appreciate more study guides or recorded lectures regarding material. I struggled with fully grasping concepts on my own.
More recorded lectures would be interesting
I can't think of anything at the moment. Soliciting our input about what was working best and not as well during the course of the semester, and making adjustments in real time was much appreciated.
I would say, providing more factual information on legislation such as why the parts of policy exist, but that may not apply to this course.
I would encourage students to maybe do a discussion post and write a synthesis at the end of the week where we can write what we think and defend our stance. I think will help us to make defensible arguments applicable outside of the classroom environment.
It was an excellent course and extremely well taught! The only thing that I came across was I thought that some of the topics for discussions were from a left of center perspective, or rather that they were left of center topics of concern to begin with. My only suggestion is to include a few topics that are discussed more in right of center outlets, organizations, and then discuss that from all sides. I think the vaccines discussion really showed some differing viewpoints. For example, maybe a discussion on abortion from the side of it being disproportionately a treatment/procedure that Black and other people of color have in the U.S. over percentages and numbers in the U.S. and that maybe that is not a good thing for that group? the lack of replacement numbers, the lack of equitable factors that may be contributing to that – as opposed to the access to abortion expansion perspective. I do understand that UVA is more progressive as many universities are, and I expected that, so that is okay. That was the only thought I had sometimes that I wanted to see different on occasion. Overall, super class! Thank you. If I could recommend you as an instructor to others I would, and will.
I would suggest different homework exercises, instead of discussion boards each week. It would be nice for a switch up now and then.
If possible, I recommend offering this course in person or in a hybrid format with some required real-time sessions. If it must remain asynchronous, reducing the discussion board load (for example, one main post and one reply instead of three substantial posts weekly) and varying activities would make the workload more sustainable.

The only thing that stressed me out significantly was the final being a take-home essay with only a week to complete, while also studying for classes that required more attention than was given due to trying to be active and efficient in this course. I also would have appreciated a week's break from the discussion boards during the week when the policy papers were due and during the holiday/fall break. While encouraging us not to do work during those times, there was no allotment of extra time to complete said assignments if truly taking the time off during those breaks.
A week for the final paper doesn't feel like enough time to me, with other finals to study for. I think at least two weeks would have been beneficial for me – I have recently found value in working on assignments a little at a time.
I like the new policy pod situation, it is nice to talk to others in my class while maintaining a small group.
I would love to see the final paper – since it is not a test – be administered earlier (1–2 weeks) in the semester since we have such a heavy course load outside of this class. Obviously it wouldn't be fair to ask her to adjust the actual exam but offering it a week or two earlier would have tremendously helped my stress surrounding it. I also really didn't like the changes that were made to the discussion board rules. There were many weeks where I posted on Monday morning and no one else posted until the following Saturday or Sunday. I know feedback supported dropping the "post by X day" but at least one post by mid-week would have relieved much of my stress around timing.
Honestly no, she implemented student feedback into the course throughout the year.
At times I felt overwhelmed by the course load. Maybe I just wasn't used to writing so much and had to re-learn how to do that. Sometimes the weekly discussions were hard to complete because I genuinely put a lot of thought and effort into it, which took time.
